



CAMP SITE INFORMATION

5th – 8th June 2025



Please take a moment to read this important information regarding camping at the Defender Bramham International Horse Trials

We wish you a comfortable and enjoyable stay at Bramham Park



OPENING TIMES

Season Camping ticket holders may access the camp site from 12.00 pm on Tuesday 3rd June until noon on Monday 9th June.

Weekend Camping ticket holders may access the camp site from **4.00 pm on Friday 6th June and not before, until 12.00 pm on Monday 9th June.**

Please do not pitch up without first seeing a Camp Site Steward; pitches will be allocated by them upon arrival.

TICKETS

Please have your e-ticket printed and/or ready to present upon arrival at the Park. **This e-ticket may only be used once.** Once at the camp site you will exchange your e-ticket for a camp site pack. This pack will contain:

- Camping wrist bands for the number of people booked on your pitch
- One vehicle pass
- A copy of all relevant information

Only those who have purchased camping tickets can stay on the camp site. If you would like extra visitors to stay on your pitch please upgrade their tickets with the Camp Site Steward. This includes all Children.

All campers under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.

PITCHES

Each pitch will be 10 m x 10 m. Only **one** vehicle is permitted on each pitch; whether your vehicle is a car, a horse box, or a camper van. Pitches are marked out in advance with the right hand peg edge on the corner of the 10m square. Please put your accommodation within this square. Pitches are allocated by the Camp Site Steward upon arrival.



GETTING TO BRAMHAM PARK

Entry to the park will be through North Lodge (**LS23 6NB**) between the hours of 6.00am and 11.00 pm. Upon your final approach to the Park please observe all yellow event traffic management signs for 'Public Camping'.

To exit please follow the one-way system.

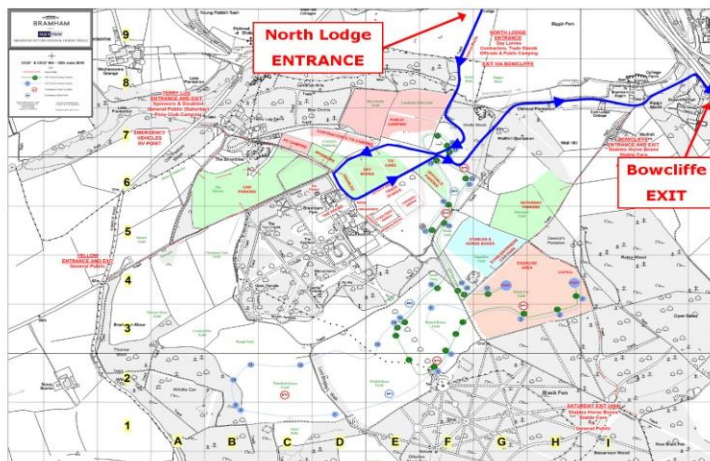
If you are travelling within the Park out of these hours, please observe the night route.

There is a strict speed limit of 20 mph inside the park



MOVEMENT ON SITE

The Organiser has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the Health and Safety of all present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring. Instructions of the Organisers, Officials and Stewards must be obeyed at all times.



VEHICLE MOVEMENT AT NIGHT

A night route will be in operation between the hours of 11.00 pm to 6.00 am from Tuesday up to and including Saturday. Anyone wishing to enter or exit the park must do so via Bowcliffe Gate (**LS23 6LR**). Your camping pass must be visible in order to get in to the Park. Anyone without a valid pass will not be permitted entry. Please refer to the map overleaf which illustrates the day (green) and night (blue) routes.



FACILITIES

Water, toilets and showers will be available to use from Wednesday morning. The nearest shop is the Bramham village store.

FOOD AND DRINK

The Member's Bar will be open in the evening as follows:

Wednesday	Access	All day
Thursday	Access from	8.00 pm
Friday	Access from	4.00 pm
Saturday	Access from	6.00 pm (with party)
Sunday		Closed

Membership to this area needs to be purchased during the day.

A selection of food and drink will be available from catering concessions during event hours.

No unaccompanied under 18s in the Member's areas during the evening.

CAMP FIRES AND BBQs

Unfortunately, we cannot allow camp fires as the risks involved are too great. Small disposable or gas barbecues are permitted, but need to be raised off the ground by 12" or more, you need to have a powder fire extinguisher to hand. Any gas cylinder must be secured in an upright position so that it cannot fall over. The cylinder must be attached to pipe work by a proper fitting.

GENERATORS

Please be considerate with your generators – your neighbour might be in a tent! Generators must be switched off between the hours of 11.00 pm and 7.00 am. They must be properly earthed if they have equipment attached to them. Fittings must be properly fixed, and cables held under cable restrains. If the generator is stored outside, the use of the old three-pin white socket is not permitted and must be replaced by blue external fittings. Please do not refuel your generator whilst the generator is hot; allow it to cool first.



PERIOD OF QUIET

Please remember to be considerate to other campers. We ask that everyone observes a period of quiet between the hours of 11.00 pm and 7.00 am. This includes turning off generators. There will be security staff at the camp site overnight; campers are required to follow their instructions and those who don't will be asked to leave the event with no re-admittance or refund due.

ACCIDENTS AND FIRST AID

If an accident occurs on the camp site please alert a Camp Site Steward. Please note that first-aiders will be site only whilst competitors are riding. If you have an accident outside of these hours, please call an ambulance if necessary and alert the Camp Site Steward. The nearest Accident and Emergency department is **Leeds General Infirmary, Great George St, Leeds, LS1 3EX, tel: 0113 243 2799**. If the incident is minor please contact the Camp Site Steward who can arrange non-urgent medical assistance. The closest Veterinary Clinic is Swift Referrals in Wetherby, LS23 7GA.

MEMBER'S TICKETS

Member's tickets can be purchased from the Organiser's Office. Upgrading your ticket to Membership will permit admittance to the exclusive ring-side Member's Bar during the day.

SHUTTLE BUGGY SERVICE – for those with mobility problems only

A limited shuttle service will run between the camp site and main event site **only** for those with mobility problems. Please note that for Health and Safety reasons, motorized off-road vehicles (quad bikes, motor bikes, etc) are not permitted anywhere within the Park.



DISABLED FACILITIES

There are no disabled showers at the camp site. Disabled toilets are located on the camp site and around the main event site. Event Mobility will be present and mobility scooters may be hired with them. Contact Event Mobility at <http://www.eventmobility.org.uk> for more information.

DOGS

All dogs are welcome, though they must be on a lead, under control and attached to their owner at all times. All dogs must be cleared up after and waste disposed of in bins provided, or otherwise removed from the event site. Dogs should never be left unattended inside locked cars. Any owner found to be in breach of these rules will be asked to leave with no refund or re-admittance due.

CROSS COUNTRY COURSE

Please do not climb on the jumps or walk anywhere within the string of the cross country course. It has taken many months of hard work to ensure that the course is in top condition for competitors.



1. PERIOD OF QUIET

All camp site residents must observe a period of quiet between the hours of 11.00 pm and 7.00 am.

2. GENERATORS

All generators must be switched off during the period of quiet.

3. DOGS

All dogs must be cleaned up after and always kept on a lead in the presence of an owner.

4. LITTER

All litter is to be picked up and disposed of in the bins provided or taken home.

5. CROSS COUNTRY COURSE

Please do not walk within the string or climb on the jumps. It has taken many months of hard work to get the ground in perfect condition for the competitors!

This Code of Conduct will be enforced by Camp Site Stewards 24 hours a day. The Organiser reserves the right to ask anyone in breach of the above to leave the event, with no right to re-admittance or refund. Please direct any queries to the Camp Site Stewards.
